Trinity Sunday
May 27th**

Trinity Sunday always falls on the Sunday immediately following Pentecost, eight weeks after Easter Day. It has been observed by western Christianity since the fourteenth century. The Trinity—God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit—is the central understanding of God in the Christian faith. Building on what is in the New Testament, the doctrine of the Trinity was articulated by later Christians in fuller form, and makes sense of Christian experience of God. Argued over, sometimes bitterly, this dynamic understanding of God, both in himself and how he reveals himself, is still believed, lived and proclaimed today.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

Wouldn't it be wonderful if Christians throughout the world prayed together? Of course, they do. There's a sense in which whenever the eucharist is celebrated, the whole Church is there for it is the action of the Church in obedience to Jesus not that of an isolated individual. Also, in Christ we are one so the prayer of one is the prayer of all. From Ascension Day to Pentecost, May 10th-20th, there is the opportunity to pray worldwide in a focussed way. In 2016, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York urged members of the Church of England to pray 'Thy kingdom come', looking for more people to come to know Jesus. They urged that people committed to a 'novena', nine days, of prayer and that is happening again this year, but now not just in England, and not just Anglican, but worldwide, and Roman Catholic, Baptist, Methodist etc. as well. The emphasis this year is 'Changed Lives, Changing Lives.' If we have known something of Jesus's power to change lives, how can we not want this for others? I'll be offering some resources for prayer and you can find out more about this prayer initiative at thykingdomcome.global
